Due to the 2020 Covid19 Pandemic and the inability to host Club activities our expenses were lower than budgeted amount. FOR THE RECORD

On March 16, 2020, Gov. Eric Holcomb halted dine-in service to control the coronavirus' spread so many business owners had to quickly shift to takeout and delivery. It was reported by the InRLA that the Indiana's restaurant industry overall lost an estimated \$433 million in sales and more than 53,000 jobs during the first 22 days of March. Social media lit up with customer calls to “support our local everything” and organizations created hashtags like #drinkindianacheers.

On March 20, members of the Indianapolis craft beer industry came together to form the Indy Independent Relief Fund (IIRF), a registered non-profit organization designed to generate and disperse funds and food to needy members of the food and alcohol service industry. Present conditions have led to the layoff of thousands of restaurant/bar and brewery employees that depend on both hourly wages/salary and tips so local companies combined forces to produce several beers, from which 100% of the sales was used by the IIRF to provide services and funds to industry workers.

As a result of their efforts, we enjoyed several collaboration brews such as Stimulus IPA, Shutdown Schwarzbier, Phase Four NEIPA, Back On Track DIPA, Empty Stage Hoppy Blond, Essential Pilsner, and Social Distance Pale Ale


BIKES AND BREWS ON THE MONON OCT 2020

- IMPORTANT NOTES-

- The 2021 version of the competition will go on, but with the pandemic situation still creating uncertainty, some of the exact dates may change, especially later in the year as the Liederkrantz and the German American Klub hopefully get to confirm dates and get back to their events.
- Beer Entries must register in advance (preferably by a week before each comp, see link below), then be delivered to Ron Smith's home (3793 Castle Rock Drive, Zionsville, IN, 46077) in the week before the judging. See the exact details that will be posted for each competition. Also, these plans may change as well as we hopefully get back to the real events.
- Open to both Pro and Home Brewers. Head-to-head competition. All entries info will be kept confidential (except for the winners). Judging feedback will be provided.
- Judging is closed to the public. Winners will be announced as soon as possible (that night or the next day), or if at the real events, usually about an hour into the events. Most events are free to attend.

MEMBER RECIPE

Here is an award-winning Trappist Single recipe from Tom Wallbank and Tim Palmer for you to try. This is a reprint of a recipe from the Winter Newsletter- 2017.

Style: **Trappist Single**

Batch Size: 11 gal Boil

Time: 90 mins

Grains:

17 lbs -Belgian Pils

1.5 lbs - Corn Sugar

Hops:

2.3 oz EKG (5.7%) - 60 mins

2.3 oz Saaz (2.0%) - 60 mins

Misc. Additions:

- 2 tsp Irish Moss - 15 mins
- 1 tsp Yeast Nutrient – 10 mins
- Water: 80% RO/20% filtered tap Salts
- Mash-1 tsp CaCl₂, 3.5 mL of Phos Acid (75%)
- Kettle 1.5 tsp CaCl₂
- Acidify sparge water to below pH of 6.
