TREASURY NOTE

Our membership numbers remain steady, as most 2021 memberships were rolled over from 2020 COVID memberships. The membership year for FBI starts on January 1st and your 2022 dues will be payable via Check or electronic payment. Considering the circumstances of the past year, events like History on Tap, Rock the Junction, Great Fermentations 25+1 Anniversary, and Indy Brew Battle were well attended. Our members donated and served 24+ kegs at events this year. I don't know how that compares to the past but that is a very charitable contribution.

I appreciate those who donate your beer and your time to represent the club. These are high-profile events and are important to our club because it fosters comradery and allows us to interact with potential new members.

The Board recognizes that the beer donated to our events can become costly, especially when you donate several times a year, so we approved a Motion to budget a total of \$400 {up to 5 events} for {stipend of \$10 per person, up to 8 members, who brings at least 2.5 gallons to serve}.

The CIA meetings continue today and while they don't always directly relate to judging, they remain technically deep.

To make this a little clearer we've decided to retire the CIA moniker and adopt a new name: the **Foam Blowers Speaker Series**. This name reflects the robust nature of these talks, doesn't tie them to judging, and ought to make it clear to newcomers what to expect.

We've had three excellent sessions so far this year, on Coolships (John Allison), Bochet Mead (Dean Steuerwald), and Kveik Yeast (Todd Cogswell). Despite our early success in garnering speakers, we have no further dates scheduled yet this year.

That's where you come in! As I've said before, you don't need to be an expert to present on a topic presenting is how you become an expert. So, if there's an aspect of brewing or judging you've always wanted to know more about, please contact Andrew K. and volunteer to present on that topic. As an added value, the Board approve a motion to increase the CIA stipend for presenters, "up to \$40 of actual expenses"

Imperial Stout Recipe

1. 14 lbs. 7.7oz Pale Malt 2 row
2. 4 lbs. 12oz Borlander Munich Malt
3. 1 lbs. White Wheat Malt
4. 14.4 oz Caramel Malt – 60 SRM
5. 14/4 oz Chocolate Malt – 350 SRM
6. 14.4 oz Roasted Barley – 300 SRM
7. 10.9 oz Black Malt – 2 Row 500 SRM
8. 1.5 oz Nugget 13% -Boil 90 min.
9. .25 oz Galaxy 14% - Boil 60 min.
10. 1 oz Willamette 5.5% - Boil 30 min.
11. 1 oz Willamette 5.5% - Boil 15 min.
12. Darkness (Imperial Yeast #A10)
